O'AHU

A trip to O'ahu isn't complete without visiting Diamond Head, the iconic volcanic crater that rises high above Honolulu. Hiking the 1.6-mile Diamond Head Summit Trail takes you through the crater's geological and military history (the crater was once part of O'ahu's coastal defense system). When you arrive at the summit, you're rewarded with a sweeping 360-degree view of the island, including world-famous Waikiki Beach. During the winter months, you might even spot a spray of migrating humpback whales in the cobalt blue water.

For a tad longer but easier hike, try the 2-mile Makapu'u Point Lighthouse Trail. The path offers great views of the eastern shore of O'ahu, and on a clear day you can see the neighboring islands of Lāna'i and Moloka'i. The lighthouse isn't open to the public, but you can get close enough to snap some photos and see the sprawling white sand beaches below.

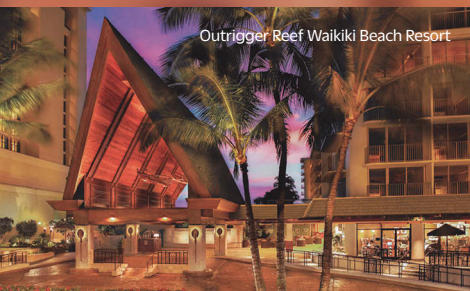
MAUI

When visiting Maui, it's hard to miss the majestic and mysterious Mt. Haleakalā shrouded in clouds towering over the island. Located in Haleakalā National Park, the summit area of the massive dormant volcano has more than 30 hiking trails, including the 5-mile Crater Trail where hikers descend into the crater and see volcanic cinder cones and rocky lava flows. For an added treat, arrive at the rim before dawn and witness one of the world's most glorious sunrises. Haleakalā's elevation is close to 10,000 feet so take it slow and bring sunscreen as well as a jacket.

To experience Maui's lush tropical landscape, take a side trip to 'Īao Valley State Park on the east side of the island. The paved trail will take you past an abundance of native Hawaiian flora and fauna, sparkling waterfalls, inviting swimming holes and the 'Īao Needle, a historic site where King Kamehameha conquered Maui's warriors in 1790 to unite the Hawaiian Islands.

KAUA'I

Known as the Garden Isle, Kaua'i is home to verdant rainforests, breathtaking waterfalls and rocky ocean cliffs looming over the thundering Pacific Ocean.

To appreciate Kaua'i's diverse terrain, visit Koke'e State Park and choose from 45 hiking trails. Some lead to Waimea Canyon, also known as the "Grand Canyon of the Pacific," with rugged buttes and deep valley gorges bathed in orange and copper tones, while others wind through steamy tropical rainforests, past refreshing waterfalls and awe-inspiring overlooks with views of Kaua'i's mountainous Napali Coast.

Hiking the Nounou Kuamo'o trail on the east side of Kaua'i takes you on a quaint wooden bridge over a bubbling stream, through a fragrant strawberry guava forest and past a grove of swaying bamboo before arriving at a forest of stately pine trees. At the top, wild orchids and aromatic eucalyptus trees surround



you while gazing at the fertile Wailua River Valley and sprawling coastline.

HAWAII ISLAND

While visiting Hawai'i Island, also known as the Big Island, make the trek to Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park to see Kīlauea

and Mauna Loa, two of the world's largest active volcanoes. Mauna Loa last erupted in 1984, but Kīlauea has been in a state of constant eruption since 1983. In the park, visitors can see rocky volcanic pit craters, calderas (volcanic craters), cinder cones and smooth lava flows. Take the 11-mile Crater Rim Drive around the summit that tra-

verses moist tropical rainforests, stark desert terrain and passes through the caldera floor. Along the way, stop at scenic overlooks for stunning photo opportunities.

The Pololū Valley provides magnificent views of the rugged northern Kohala Coast on the way to the valley floor, where the forest will envelop you. Cross

over the Pololū River bridge and walk on the beach made of polished lava rocks and cool off in the turquoise water. Hike a little farther through a misty rainforest where you can pluck wild guava and other tropical fruits along the trail. Then you'll arrive at the Honokāne Nui Valley overlook with breathtaking views of the

lush green landscape and deeply cut valleys below.
